

The Historic Landmark Plaque Program



Established: 11/1/91

Under the chairmanship of Brenda Benzar (Butler), the Historic Landmark Plaque program was established. Its purpose was to encourage recognition of and preservation of properties/ structures in the Village worthy of note. The owners of houses featured in *From Camargo to Indian Hill* and *Treasured Landmarks* of Indian Hill were offered the opportunity to purchase and display these plaques.

The design was done by Ken Bradford, whose work on the Riverside Walk in Kentucky and the Blue Ash Memorial Park had won many awards. The mold for the casting of the 11" x 17" solid bronze plaques was done by Art in Bronze (Sheidow Bronze Company) in Kingwood, West Virginia.

Any structure in the Village may be nominated by its owner for a plaque. Determination of eligibility (based on published Plaque Criteria) will be made by the Plaque Committee.

As of 9/2023, there are 98 plaques on structures in the Village. The current price of a plaque is \$1,000. It is made by Matthews International.
