Educational Outreach

In addition to the monthly programs, the Society is active with education outreach through:

4th Grade One Room Schoolhouse Experience:

Starting in 1992, each year the Society hosts local 4th graders at the Little Red Schoolhouse so they may experience what it was like to go to school in the 1800s. The program is held in the morning for 2 weeks and serves approximately 250-300 children. The morning field trip consists of:

- Ringing the school bell to welcome the students
- Having an interactive session with the students about the history of Ohio and Indian Hill
- Experiencing 5 stations:
 - Reading from McGuffey's Reader
 - Writing with dip-ink pens
 - Working math problems on small slates
 - Identifying tools and household items from the 1800s
 - Playing marbles

Indian Hill Bulletin publishes monthly historical topics researched and written by Society staff

Quarterly newsletters cover a wide array of topics related to the Indian Hill Historical Society and history and are written by Society staff

The Annual **Authors Series**, in coordination with Cincinnati Country Day School & Indian Hill High School, brings an author known for historical writings for lectures / presentations which are open to the public. Additionally, the author typically meets with students for a presentation and Q&A discussions. The inaugural event was in 2022.

Presentations to local groups, usually about a local historical topic, are given by Society staff
