Subject: Publications/Books

2/1/1983 First segment of *From Camargo to Indian Hill* book deadline

2/1/1983 Small "*Cookie Cookbook*" suggested.

3/8/1983 *From Camargo to Indian Hill* publication proceeding.

5/3/1983 Added a goal for IHMMA of: "complete and sell at least 2,000 copies of our book *From Camargo to Indian Hill* (FCIH) to raise money for operating expenses." 5/3/83 Voted to delay publication of FCIH delayed for one year.

6/7/1983 Pre-publication sale plan (\$25 per book) for FCIH proposed.

9/6/1983 Permission granted to use "Map of Camargo" on end sheets or fly leaf of FCIH.

11/1/1983 Sales price of FCIH raised to \$35.00.

3/6/1984 Distribution & sales of FCIH a success. 450 copies already picked up.

6/12/1984 See minutes of this date for background information regarding FCIH publication.

8/8/1984 Voted to file suit against The Hubbard Co. re the publication of FCIH and money charged in excess of agreed price.

9/16/1984 Hubbard Co. attorney replied they still feel IHMMA owes them \$50,000 for FCIH. (suit later settled)

1987 See minutes for progress of Cookbook publication.

10/6/1987 Re Cookbook: 2,000 copies printed, over 600 sold to date.

4/5/1988 First mention of "Landmark" publication by IHHS. (Village had declined to participate in Miami Purchase Assn. landmark project.) This possible publication called a "brochure."

- 8/2/1988 Work proceeding with photos, etc. of proposed structures for landmarks "brochure."
- 11/1/1988 "Brochure" of landmark properties in progress. All photos completed, and owners to be contacted.
- 5/8/1990 Treasured Landmarks of Indian Hill (TL) art work in process for new "booklet." Publication to be completed approximately 9/1990.
- 4/28/1991 T. L. art work still in process. Approx. 60 structures to be depicted in the "book."
- 1/14/92 Treasured Recipes being sold at 2 for 1.
- 6/6/1993 No definite estimates for Treasured Landmarks book costs. IHHS has no contract with the artist for the drawings. Original impression was that there would be no charge. Publication postponed. It was decided to require definite cost of project before continuing.
- 9/14/1993 Voted to pay artist price requested for drawings, and to proceed with Treasured Landmarks book, with a temporary loan from Cinti. Preservation Assn. (formerly Miami Purchase Assn.) to assist in initial expenses.
- 4/12/1994 Notepaper completed for sale with C. Williams drawing of Schoolhouse.
- 5/10/1994 Board voted to repay loan to Cinti. Preservation Assn. for expenses on Treasured Landmarks book, and assume full responsibility for marketing, etc. of the book.
- 10/11/1994 Secured ISBN number for Treasured Landmarks. (Note for future: good for ten books.)
- 1/27/1992 Special monthly Historical Society page started in Bulletin. IHHS news, programs, activities featured, with photographs and illustrations.
- 1995 Bicentennial Gazette (2 pages) appeared monthly as centerfold in I.H. Village Bulletin. Monthly articles traced story of Indian Hill from 1795 to 1995. Bound copies available 3/12/1996.
- 2/1995 Cat's Meow series of wooden replicas of structures in Indian Hill begun.
- 2/5/1996 Images..then and now page began appearing monthly in the Indian Hill Village Bulletin.
- 1/16/1996 Treasured Landmarks books removed from original batch consignment shops at time of publication.
- 9/10/1996 Cat's Meow program on hold with five figures. Franchise rests with different outlet.

4/15/1997 Two additional Cat 's Meow figures being handled by Storybook Kids shop. IHHS will handle these two only in small quantity, to meet requests of members. No further plans by IHHS to initiate additional figures.

2002-03 Copies of Map of Camargo 1928 found at printers. Secured over 400 copies, and offered them for sale to residents for \$25 matted and \$50 framed.

9/2008 Publication of Indian Hill. A Point of View with photos of painting by Leslie G. Shiels with anecdotes by William H. Chatfield.

11/2018 Little Red Schoolhouse Jigsaw puzzle was updated with current picture, 16" x 20", 504 pieces. (Do not know date of original puzzle production.)
